A Webex Poll was conducted as attendees were joining the online forum. The poll asked participants if they had visited Carrington Moss in the past week, how they had travelled, whether they had seen any flora or fauna and whether they had recorded their sightings. The resulting information was used in discussions with the first speaker.

Presentation 1– Recording Wildlife on Carrington Moss Stuart Robinson, Environmental Records Officer at Greater Manchester's Local Records Centre (GMLRC), which is part of the GM Ecology Unit

Stuart covered the importance of recording all bird and wildlife sightings, he provided details of the records held by the GMLRC pertaining to Carrington Moss and some insights into the protected species found on Carrington Moss.

Presentation 2 – Birdlife on Carrington Moss James Walsh, (aka The Mancunian Birder) ecologist, author and bird watcher.

James talked in a little more detail about the bird species on Carrington Moss. He shared a number of links to videos and blogs (the links are embedded in the AGM slide pack). James also mentioned Greater Manchester's (virtual) Green Summit, which, this year, will be running from 21st to 24th September.

Stuart and James responded to a number of questions from participants about a wide variety of issues. It was confirmed that FOCM will be hosting further public (virtual) meetings and outdoor recording events (when safe to do so) in the near future.

In addition, to support our aim to promote the ecology, the habitats and the wildlife on Carrington Moss, FOCM launched a <u>short survey</u> to provide local residents with the opportunity to help select the species they think best represent Carrington Moss. Participants at the AGM were asked to start thinking about the **Carrington Moss Big Five.**
